Fees

The LmunA conference is a non-profit conference. However, there are a great number of costs connected to the organisation of the conference. We therefore have to ask for a fee.

Dress Code

As LmunA is a simulation of the United Nations, all participants are expected to dress appropriately. This means that the dress code is **formal**. Every attending participant should be dressed formally and appropriately, this includes the following. Participants should always wear a jacket, shirt and tie, participants can also choose to wear dresses and skirts, which should have an appropriate length. They cannot be shorter than three fingers above the knee. Cleavage should not be one hand under the collarbone. Sneakers and jeans are prohibited. If participants are dressed inappropriately, they will be requested to change clothing. Scarves and clothing worn for religious reasons are permitted.

Disclaimer: the Organizing Committee always reserves the right to ask to change clothing if they feel the dress code is violated.

Smoking, Alcohol and Drugs

The usage of (electronic) cigarettes, cigars, alcohol and other drugs are strictly forbidden during the entire conference. This includes the conference at the Lorentz Lyceum, as well as the party and the StOff/Staff dinner.

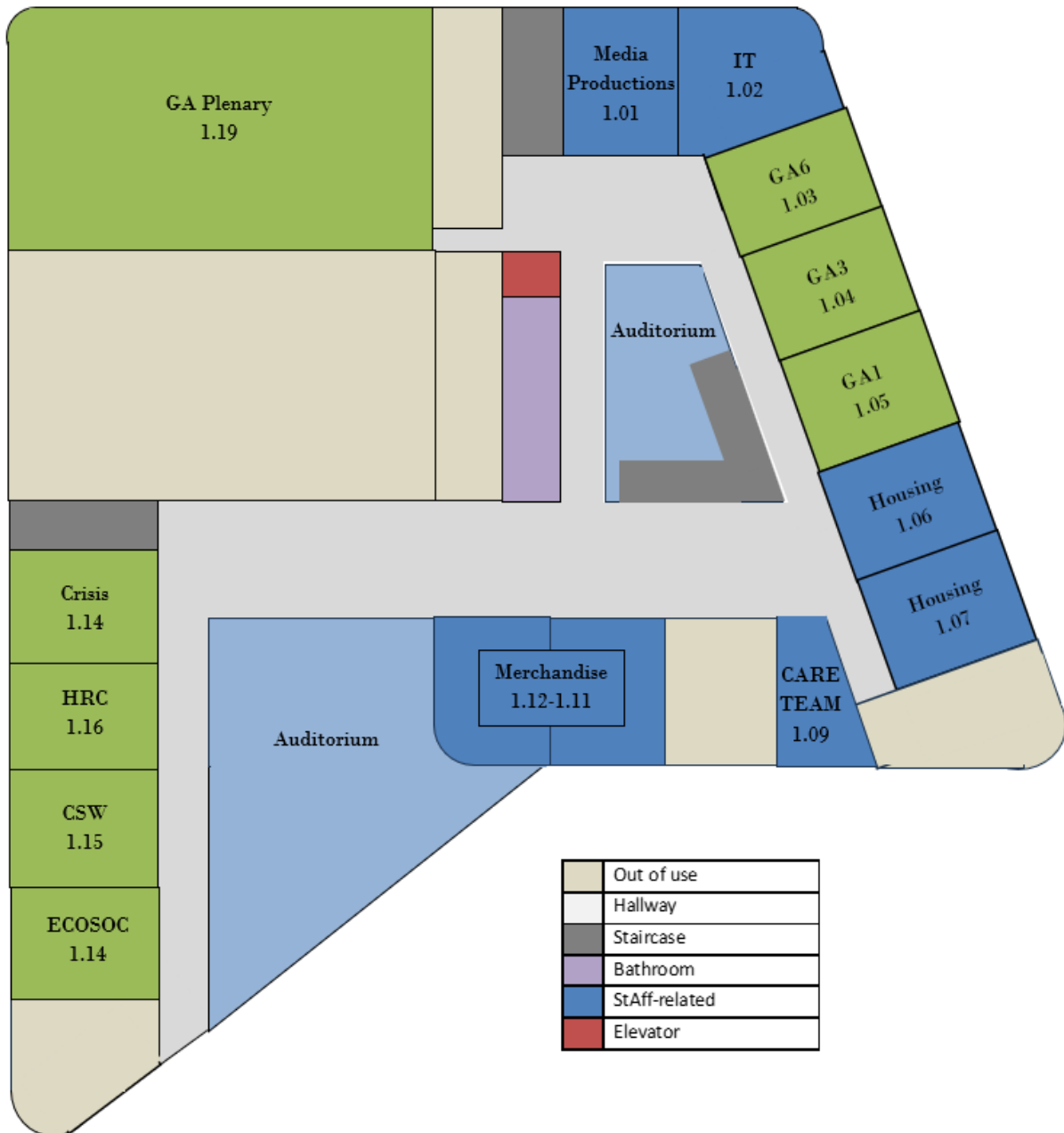
School plan
